It's my very great pleasure to be Spiritual Director of the Men's Walk for 2018. I follow in a long line of very eminent Methodist clergy, so I hope, with God's help, that I can measure up to this noble and holy task.

I did my 'Walk' back in 2013, I believe, and enjoyed and profited from the devotion and commitment of the people I met, among both the team and the pilgrims. It's a wonderful opportunity to experience the talks on the Christian life being shared and explained again, especially by people experienced in living these God-given truths.



We are living in an increasingly secular Ireland, an Ireland that is fast moving away from the wonderful Christian culture that has sustained it for hundreds of years. Welcome to the Emmaus Community Ireland. It's a joy and privilege to have shared with you in your Emmaus Walk. Every time I have the opportunity to serve on an Emmaus team, I see God's transforming hand and amazing grace. I remember my own walk 12 years ago when God healed me in a deep way: "my chains fell off, my heart was free, I rose, went forth, and followed thee" (Charles Wesley). Nothing was the same after that weekend. I may have returned to the same circumstances but I was not the same. I was forever changed and couldn't continue the same safe, comfortable way of living. Instead God took me on an adventure, in directions that challenged and stretched me, and through it all God loved and supported me.



Your experience of the Emmaus Walk is unique. You may have found it challenging, inspiring, encouraging, healing, or a struggle. As you prepare to go home, the situation you are returning to probably hasn't changed but thanks to God's dynamic power and love, you have changed. My prayer for you is, that all you experienced during these 72 hours continues to inspire you and lead you into a life lived more deeply with Christ. "It only takes a spark to get a fire going" (Kurt Kaiser). Be the spark in your communities and watch God's transforming love and power at work, becoming the fire of renewal and revival. Reunion Groups

My name is Gary Dunn and I coordinate the reunion groups on behalf of the board.

I would encourage all of us to be part of a reunion group, even if you already meet in a bible study or life group.

My own reunion group had grown to six and so we recently split into two groups of three. We meet on Saturday mornings once a month in a local cafe. A reunion group ideally should have between two and five people and meet together regularly. What is discussed in the group, is of course confidential and it should be a place where you can build real relationships with like minded people and pray for and encourage each other in your fourth day journey.

There are reunion groups meeting in lots of different areas and at different times so hopefully there will be one that matches your time and location. I am happy to chat with you at any gathering or by email to help you find a group or start one. Maybe your sponsor will also be able to help you find a group or start a new group with you.

So why be in a reunion group. Your reunion group will pray with you and for you. You will be encouraged to think about your Christian action and how you can live out your faith in practical ways everyday. Your fellow group members will hold you accountable and also be accountable to you. The little reunion card that we all got on our Walks helps to keep the group focussed. Meeting in a group with people that have also done an Emmaus Walk is also a great way to stay connected to the community and maybe together help run a gathering or just travel together to a gathering or other community event. A lot of the agape gifts you got on your walk will have been made by a reunion group.

Finally your commitment to a reunion group doesn't have to involve a lot of time, my group meets from 8.30 to 9.30am and in that time share breakfast together, and by being honest and real we discuss the struggles and victories in our lives.

I hope this encourages you to be in a reunion group whether you have just done your Walk or you did your Walk many years ago.

May we all be richly blessed in all our fourth days.
